GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

REOPENING PROTOCOLS See the Council program matrix HERE. Here are some highlights:

- 1. Council offers opportunities for Scouts, families and units to participate in program at our Council properties <u>under the supervision of Council employees</u> as permitted by Council's day camp license. See instructions for making reservations in the following article.
- 2. UNITS MAY NOT MEET IN PERSON UNDER VOLUNTEER SUPERVISION. The *one* exception provided by the County Health Order is for youth sports activities. These activities mean physical exertion in the outdoors by a single cohort, such as hiking or cycling (not, for example, shooting sports or Whittlin'/Totin' Chip instruction). In order to conduct an outing under this exception, units must obtain permission from the Chartered Org, follow all County protocols and the Guide to Safe Scouting, submit a Scouting Activity Permit form, stay in an established cohort, and maintain adequate documentation (time, place, communication regarding conditions of attendance, attendees, etc.) to facilitate quarantining & contact tracing should a cohort member be diagnosed with COVID-19.
- 3. Cohorts must be dicrete, small, and stable. Participants within a cohort that already exists, *whether in Scouting or not*, cannot mix unless at least 15 days have elapsed since the last time they have met. No one, whether youth or adult, should be in multiple cohorts.
- 4. In addition to following County guidelines, units need to follow the <u>re-opening checklist provided by National</u>, including obtaining permission from your Chartering Organization before pursuing any in-person activities. Keep the documentation of the Chartering Org's guidance.
- 5. If multiple youth are attending an authorized in-person activity, they must ride in vehicles as household units—no carpooling is permitted.
- 6. Unit overnight activities are NOT allowed.

Failure to follow these guidelines puts youth at risk and places any liability on the volunteers leading the activities. In this time of increased public doubt regarding the BSA's commitment to safety, please comply with public health orders without exception. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to reach out to your <u>Commissioner</u> for clarification.

<u>UNIT USE OF CABRILLO</u> Reservations are now open for sites at Cabrillo (as well as other Council properties). You will need to do two things prior to making a reservation:

- 1) Establish a UNIT Tentaroo account, if you don't already have one. This is different from any personal accounts your Scouters may have! If you are having trouble accessing your unit account, email tishank@mac.com to re-set your credentials.
- 2) Complete our <u>Online Booking Request form</u>. Note: it may take 3-5 business days to approve your first booking. For more information, please consult the resource packet from last month's Jumpstart Unit Program in 2021 webinar.
