REOPENING PROTOCOLS Refer to the Council COVID page: https://www.glaacbsa.org/COVID-19

- 1. Council offers opportunities for Scouts, families and units to participate in program at our Council properties <u>under the supervision of Council employees</u> as permitted by Council's day camp license. You can make a reservation via your <u>UNIT Tentaroo account</u>. (Council emailed login credentials to unit leaders and committee chairs 9/7/20.)
- 2. Units wishing to meet under volunteer supervision following "Youth and Adult Sports Leagues" protocols need permission from their Chartering Organizations to do so. Make sure you are using the <u>CURRENT County protocols</u> for and the <u>Guide to Safe Scouting</u>. - 3. Unit overnight/camping activities and car pooliing are still NOT allowed.

Failure to follow guidelines puts youth at risk and places any liability on the volunteers leading the activities. In this time of increased public doubt regarding the BSA's commitment to safety, please comply with public health orders without exception. WOOD BADGE 2021 Wood Badge is a premier leadership workshop for any position-trained adult leader who wants to give youth the best Scouting experience possible. We will teach you tools and techniques that can improve every aspect of your Pack, Troop, or Crew as well as your life outside of Scouting. New to Scouting? This is, by far, the best way to get up to speed. This year's Wood Badge course will run over five days (April 30 - May 2, 2021, and May 15 & 16) at the Cabrillo Beach Youth Center. The curriculum has just been updated, so participants on this course will be the first to experience best practices gleaned over BSA's first century, presented in a new and exciting way. The course will be taught Day Camp style, with no overnights, in accordance to County Health Guidelines. All instruction will take place outdoors, weather permitting, to keep participants as safe as possible.
