## GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

<u>REOPENING PROTOCOLS</u> THERE HAVE BEEN ONLY SMALL CHANGES TO COUNTY GUIDELINES AS THEY PERTAIN TO SCOUTING. Refer to the Council COVID page: <a href="https://www.glaacbsa.org/COVID-19">https://www.glaacbsa.org/COVID-19</a>

- 1. Council offers opportunities for Scouts, families and units to participate in program at our Council properties <u>under the supervision of Council employees</u> as permitted by Council's day camp license. You can make a reservation via your <u>UNIT Tentaroo account</u>. (Council emailed login credentials to unit leaders and committee chairs 9/7/20.)
- Units wishing to meet under volunteer supervision following "Youth and Adult Sports Leagues" protocols need
  permission from their Chartering Organizations to do so. Make sure you are using the <u>CURRENT County protocols</u>
  for and the <u>Guide to Safe Scouting</u>. See additional information in the 2/23 webinar slides and unit resources on the

- 3. Unit overnight/camping activities and car pooling are still NOT allowed. Families may leave the County for day-long Scouting activities.
- 4. Prospective families can participate in your unit's in person activities provided they fill in all the required paperwork and their participation in your cohort does not put you over 14 youth. If they are strictly side line observers, there is no additional paperwork.

Failure to follow guidelines puts youth at risk and places any liability on the volunteers leading the activities. In this time of increased public doubt regarding the BSA's commitment to safety, please comply with public health orders without exception. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to reach out to your <u>Commissioner</u> for clarification.

Members are sent virtual Meeting invitations via the LodgeMaster application.

Units are encouraged to keep paper copies of their participants' forms in a confidential medical file for quick access in an emergency and in preparation for all adventures. If you or your Scout supplies medical forms to participate in a camp or activity on Council property you must take the forms home with you when the activity has concluded. By law, any forms remaining at the end of the activity will be destroyed.
