## GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

**REOPENING PROTOCOLS** There was a lot of great information at last week's Camp Reopening Webinar. You can find the webinar slides, recording, and supporting resources on the Council COVID page <a href="https://www.glaacbsa.org/COVID-19">www.glaacbsa.org/COVID-19</a>

- 1. We encourage unit cohorts to meet in person in accordance with the latest <u>County protocols</u>. A summary of protocols and requirements is in our <u>Reopening Update</u> document. Now that cohorts can re-set every 11 days, it's possible to schedule in-person activities every other week. If you have any trouble finding an appropriate outdoor venue to hold your meetings, please let your <u>Commissioner know</u>. Note that the fee waiver for unit day use of Cabrillo has expired.
- 2. Our Council camps are running great day programs now and have fantastic long term opportunities ready for the summer. Events and dates are being added frequently—read the <u>Council Newsletter</u> and check the <u>Council calendar</u> often!
- 3. Our camps are also offering day & overnight service (not program) opportunities to units. You can find a sample protocol <u>HERE</u>. Contact Camping Facilities manager <u>mark.serratt@scouting.org</u> for more information.

<u>GET READY FOR A NEW CHARTER YEAR!</u> Recharter is just a few months away. Summer is a great time to start planning adventures for the upcoming year!

- 1. Schedule summer adventures. There are still slots left for Scouts BSA Summer Camp! Registration for Cub Day/Twilight Camp and Scouts BSA Day camp at Cabrillo will be posted to Tentaroo soon.
- 2. Update your <u>Annual Health and Medical records</u>. As a reminder, <u>BSA policy</u> prohibits email transmission and/or electronic storage of health forms--keep paper copies in a confidential medical file for quick access. Remember that anyone attending a long term (72+ hours) event will need a pre-participation physical.
- 3. Create your annual plan and budget. Your <u>Commissioner</u> can provide you templates if you need them.
- 4. Draft your <u>recruiting plan</u>. Update your <u>BeAScout pin</u>. Consider leaving a few cohort spots open so prospective families can participate in your activities. If you need geofencing for an event, yard signs, trifolds, post cards for lapsed members, or other recruiting materials, reach out to your <u>Commissioner</u>.
- 5. Scrub your roster in My.Scouting (not Scoutbook). Do all your members appear on it? If not, tell your <a href="Commissioner.">Commissioner.</a> With the recent addition of Position Manager in My.Scouting/Roster, CORs can update any changes (e.g. current Scouters volunteering to become Den Leaders) to your unit leadership team.
