## **GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS**

<u>NEW ROUNDTABLE COMMISSIONER WANTED</u> After serving for the past three years as Roundtable Commissioner for Pacifica, I'm feeling that it's time to pass the torch and direct my focus on other priorities. If anyone would be interested in taking over as Roundtable Commissioner or feels they know of someone who would be a good fit, please let Nancy or myself know.

### GET READY FOR A NEW SCOUTING YEAR! This is a great time to plan adventures for the upcoming year!

- 1. Scrub your roster in My.Scouting (not Scoutbook). Do all your members appear on it? If not, have them <u>apply online</u> using your unit's unique code in Invitation Manager. CORs can update any position changes (e.g. current Scouters volunteering to become Den Leaders) to your unit leadership team using Position Manager in My.Scouting/Roster.
- 2. Create your annual plan and budget. (Here are links to Pack, Troop, Ship and Crew planning resources)
- 3. Draft your recruiting plan using the Membership Growth plans on the Council website.
- 4. Update your <u>Annual Health and Medical</u> records. As a reminder, BSA policy *prohibits email transmission and/or electronic storage of health forms*--keep paper copies in a confidential medical file for quick access. Remember that anyone attending a long term (72+ hours) event will need a pre-participation physical.

**RENEW YOUR YPT!** Pacifica's standard is that adults must have YPT certificates that are valid for the entire charter period. Please plan ahead and make sure that your returning team's certs expire no earlier than 1 October 2023.

**COMPLY WITH AB506 REQUIREMENTS ASAP** AB 506 went into effect on January 1, 2022. All registered BSA volunteer positions must comply with AB506. Visit <a href="https://californiascouting.org/glaac/">https://californiascouting.org/glaac/</a> for step-by-step instructions. Our February issue of <a href="Roundtable Matters">Roundtable Matters</a> included tips for taking the required training. Our <a href="March edition">March edition</a> provided tips for LiveScan appointments. Units with adults needing financial assistance with LiveScan fees can apply for Council aid <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. Adults who have not completed this training will not be re-registered.

**2022-2023 MEMBERSHIP FEES ANNOUNCED** Effective 1 August, the fees for re-registering youth are \$147 per year and adults are \$77 per year. A 12 month Scout Life subscription is now \$15, and the Unit Recharter Fee has increased to \$100. See a table of fees on the GLAAC website.

Please note that you DO NOT need to collect re-registration fees for members who have registered online 1 July 2022 or later. Families pay directly to National/Council via the online system and new members will show as PRE-PAID on your re-enrollment roster. <u>WHAT'S IN YOUR WELCOME PACKET?</u> A recent article in BSA's Commissioner Newsletter provided suggested contents to attract and welcome new families. They include:

- A letter that includes basic (and brief) information about uniforms, camping, general leadership structure, the role of the parent, youth protection policies and a link to the unit's webpage or social media platform. (Check out BSA's guide for new Cub families)

Scout profile and join date will be requested from Council and Scout will be assigned a book check person. Please do not contact Council directly for profile or join date. Once the Eagle book and application are ready, call Mrs. Christensen at (310) 283-7197, for the Pacifica verification and review.

Starting July 1, 2022, Eagle Scout candidates will be required to complete all Eagle Scout requirements including the new Citizenship in Society Merit Badge. Members ("Arrowmen") provide service their home Units, the Pacifica District, our Council, and BSA nationally. OA provides Youth members additional service and leadership opportunities that help them grow and build experience. Members are sent virtual Meeting invitations via the LodgeMaster application. National OA guidance on counting virtual camping for OA membership elegibility was updated in January 2021 and may be found <a href="here">here</a>. 2022 Lodge dues may be paid here (note – users will need to create a Tentaroo account if they don't already have one).
