<u>NEW ROUNDTABLE COMMISSIONER WANTED</u> After serving for the past three years as Roundtable Commissioner for Pacifica, I'm feeling that it's time to pass the torch and direct my focus on other priorities. If anyone would be interested in taking over as Roundtable Commissioner or feels they know of someone who would be a good fit, please let Nancy or myself know.

<u>SAFETY MOMENT FOR AUGUST</u> Sometimes you just say "no" to an activity when you "know" the program of the Boy Scouts of America. Did you "know" there are activities and programs that should NOT be part of any Scouting experience? Or that there are limits for when some activities should be introduced? As you draft your unit's annual program, make sure you're aware of the <u>age appropriate guidelines</u> and <u>prohibited activities</u> for what to avoid. Examples of prohibited activities include laser tag, bubble ball, and tree climbing.

GET READY FOR A NEW SCOUTING YEAR! This is a great time to plan adventures for the upcoming year!

- 1. Scrub your roster in My.Scouting (not Scoutbook). Do all your members appear on it? If not, have them <u>apply online</u> using your unit's unique code in Invitation Manager. CORs can update any position changes (e.g. current Scouters volunteering to become Den Leaders) to your unit leadership team using Position Manager in My.Scouting/Roster.
- 2. Create your annual plan and budget. (Here are links to Pack, Troop, Ship and Crew planning resources)
- 3. Draft your recruiting plan using the Membership Growth plans on the Council website.
- 4. Update your <u>Annual Health and Medical</u> records. As a reminder, BSA policy *prohibits email transmission and/or electronic storage of health forms*--keep paper copies in a confidential medical file for quick access. Remember that anyone attending a long term (72+ hours) event will need a pre-participation physical.

<u>UNIT MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL SEASON HAS STARTED!</u> Unit renewal reps are following the steps in Pacifica's Recharter Guides to getyour unit's paperwork submitted by September 30th. The <u>fees for re-registering</u> youth are \$147 per year and adults are \$77 per year. While we will not be accepting new applications with recharter packages, the online system will to accept applications except for a brief period starting 27 Sep, so don't hesitate to have new families join at any time!

RENEW YOUR YPT! Pacifica's standard is that adults must have YPT certificates that are valid for the entire charter period. Please plan ahead and make sure that your returning team's certs expire no earlier than 1 October 2023.

COMPLY WITH AB506 REQUIREMENTS ASAP AB 506 went into effect on January 1, 2022. All registered BSA volunteer positions must comply with AB506. Visit https://californiascouting.org/glaac/ for step-by-step instructions. Our February issue of Roundtable Matters included tips for taking the required training. Our March edition provided tips for LiveScan appointments. Units with adults needing financial assistance with LiveScan fees can apply for Council aid HERE. Adults who have not completed this training will not be re-registered.

GEAR UP FOR FALL RECRUITING! Fall is one of the busiest times to bring new (and lapsed) families into Scouting. Check out GLAAC's Growth Plan guides for Packs & Troops, order yard signs, banners, and more, and check out the new graphic designs in the BSA Brand Center. NEW TOOLKIT FOR SERVING SCOUTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS The BSA Special Needs and Disabilities Committee (SNDC) has just released a new A-to-Z online resource for special needs information. Formally called the Inclusion Toolbox for Special Needs and Disabilities, it is tailored to Scouting and written for any Scout leader who wants to help his/her Scouts without having to wade through special needs jargon on the internet. The Toolbox is filled with stand-alone modules so you can use it just like a physical toolbox: rummage around for what you need. MINOR MODIFICATIONS TO SCOUTS BSA RANK REQUIREMENTS

Beginning August 1, 2022, these minor modifications to the Scouts BSA requirements for the ranks of Scout through Star will take effect. Scouts may continue using the existing requirements for the rank on which they are currently working, or they may choose to use the new requirements. Scouts must use the new requirements once they advance to their next rank. On January 1, 2023, all Scouts must use only the new requirements. The specific changes can be found here. In addition, beginning July 1, 2022, the Citizenship in Society merit badge becomes required for the rank of Eagle.

EAGLE ADVANCEMENT Prior to contacting Pacifica District for approval, please review Eagle application and Eagle book with your troop advancement chair to confirm records agree with troop records and Eagle book is complete. Scout profile and join date will be requested from Council and Scout will be assigned a book check person. Please do not contact Council directly for profile or join date. Once the Eagle book and application are ready, call Mrs. Christensen at (310) 283-7197, for the Pacifica verification and review.

Starting July 1, 2022, Eagle Scout candidates will be required to complete all Eagle Scout requirements including the new Citizenship in Society Merit Badge. If you have any questions, contact District Advancement Chair Jim Matsushita at imatsushita.bsa@gmail.com

Members ("Arrowmen") provide service their home Units, the Pacifica District, our Council, and BSA nationally. OA provides Youth members additional service and leadership opportunities that help them grow and build experience. Members are sent virtual Meeting invitations via the LodgeMaster application. National OA guidance on counting virtual camping for OA membership elegibility was updated in January 2021 and may be found here (note – users will need to create a Tentaroo account if they don't already have one).
