CAMP CARD SALES ARE UNDERWAY! GLAAC's Camp Card sales run through June 30th and are designed to help Scouts at all program levels earn funds to offset the cost of their Scouting experience. A Camp Card is a discount card with numerous digital coupons and discounts to restaurants and retailers throughout Los Angeles. Camp cards' low price point (\$10), high value (generally \$100-\$200 in savings). high commission (50% goes to the unit) and easy logistics (well over 1000 cards fit in a shoe box) make Camp Cards a highly effective money earning activity. What's even better is that there is no up-front cost. You simply order cards on consignment and only pay for those you sell. Unsold cards can be returned without penalty.
