GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

SAFETY MOMENT FOR AUGUST The BSA has adopted <u>Barriers to Abuse</u> policies for the safety and well-being of its members. These policies primarily protect youth members; however, they also serve to protect adult leaders. Registered leaders must follow these guidelines with Scouting youth outside of Scouting activities. Is it time to refresh your commitment by completing your <u>Youth Protection Training</u>?

RENEW YOUR YPT! Pacifica's standard is that adults must have YPT certificates that are valid for the entire charter period. Please plan ahead and make sure that your returning team's certs expire no earlier than 1 October 2024.

FALL RECRUITING SEASON IS HERE! As families get ready for school to start, they're looking for fun activities for their kids. Be ready to offer Scouting as a great program the entire family can enjoy!

- Have your leadership in place for the upcoming school year. Need more adult help? Check out these <u>resources</u> from the Atlanta Area Council. The <u>Den Leader recruiting script</u> may be particularly relevant for Packs.
 Remember, with BSA's implementation of <u>Family Dens</u> in grades K-4, it's perfectly OK to have co-ed dens and multi-age/rank dens.
- 2. Have a Welcome Packet ready for distribution. See our helpful tips below.
- 3. Make sure your BeAScout.org listing (aka "pin") stands out! The <u>BSA Online Registration Page</u> has a great tutorial on the mechanics of building a pin. Click <u>HERE</u> for sample unit descriptions.
- 4. Order your recruiting materials early! Council can provide a wonderful variety of flyers, yard signs, give-aways and more.
- 5. Request geofences to help publicize your recruiting events.

Remember, you can accept online applications until the recharter "blackout" occurs, usually around September 25th. New members will show as "prepaid" on your renewal roster, so don't be afraid to recruit new members and renew continuing members simultaneously. As a reminder, National/Council membership fees are NONREFUNDABLE, so please make sure prospective families are ready to commit to a full 12 months of adventure when they sign up.

<u>CUBS SOON CAN CAMP TWO CONSECUTIVE NIGHTS</u> The BSA is putting out updated guidance for Cub Scout camping. <u>HERE</u> is a link to an article from Aaron on Scouting that talks about the coming update which allows units to plan events with two consecutive nights of camping. The updated policy also applies to Webelos and Arrow of Light dens, who can now conduct campouts for up to two consecutive nights.

RECHARTER TASKS THIS MONTH Re-registration will be here before you know it. Here is a <u>handy graphic of the timeline</u> that we're shooting for. Key tasks for units this month include:

- Keep working on YPT and position training.
- Make sure you can log into the Online Recharter Tool in Internet Advancement 2.0
- Collect payment from returning youth and adult members. If unit families need financial assistance beyond what the unit can provide, have them apply for Financial Aid from GLAAC HERE.
- Get your Annual Charter Agreement signed
- Reserve a date & time to submit your renewal as soon as appointments are released at the end of August.

GET READY FOR A NEW SCOUTING YEAR! This is a great time to plan adventures for the upcoming year! 1. Review your roster in My.Scouting (not Scoutbook). Do all your members appear on it? If not, have them apply online using your unit's unique code in Invitation Manager. 2. Create your annual plan and budget. (Journey to Excellence

3. Draft your recruiting plan using the Membership Growth plans posted with <u>June's Roundtable materials</u>. Freshen

4. Update your <u>Annual Health and Medical records</u>. Part A serves as a talent release form. Make sure you have one on file for ALL participants (parents, siblings, etc.) As a reminder, BSA policy prohibits email transmission and/or electronic storage of health forms--keep paper copies in a confidential medical file for quick access.

WHAT'S IN YOUR WELCOME PACKET? Suggested items include:

• A simple calendar for the next 3–6 months (or for the year if the unit is well organized). (Click <u>HERE</u> for samples from Atlanta Area Council.)

- Contact information for unit leaders.
- A letter that includes basic (and brief) information about uniforms, camping, general leadership structure, the role of the parent, youth protection policies and a link to the unit's webpage or social media platform. (Check out BSA's guide for new Cub families)
- A list of anticipated costs for the next year along with fundraising opportunities to address those costs. (BSA's budget templates for <u>Packs</u> and <u>Troops</u> may be helpful)
- Flyer from the Scout Shop for 10% off new member uniforms (flyer is included in <u>July RTM</u>)

EAGLE ADVANCEMENT Eagle candidates please review the "2023 Path to Eagle" (Rev. 4/2023). See these great tips from Scouting Magazine on helping Scouts, especially those who are neurodivergent, on their path to Eagle. Prior to contacting Pacifica District for approval, please review Eagle application and Eagle book with your troop advancement chair to confirm records agree with troop records and Eagle book is complete. Scout profile and join date will be requested from Council and Scout will be assigned a book check person. Please do not contact Council directly for profile or join date. Please call Mrs. Christensen at (310) 283-7197 for the Pacifica verification and review once the Eagle book and application are ready.

ATTENTION MERIT BADGE COUNSELORS It is nearly time to acknowledge that you wish to continue as a Merit Badge Counselor for the 2024 calendar year. Watch your email for a message asking you for your response and make sure to respond "YES" when you receive it if you wish to continue to volunteer. Meanwhile, make sure your YPT is current through the entire 2024 calendar year. All Merit Badge Counselor registrations expire at the end of 2023, so please respond before that date so you can be re-registered. I want to thank all the current merit badge counselors for their commitment to our program and our youth.

ORDER OF THE ARROW (OA) The OA is Scouting's Honor Society for Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts. Members ("Arrowmen") provide service to their home Units, the Pacifica District, our Council, and BSA nationally. OA provides Youth members additional service and leadership opportunities that help them grow and build experience. Members are sent virtual Meeting invitations via the LodgeMaster application. National OA guidance on counting virtual camping for OA membership eligibility was updated in December 2021 and may be found here.

The next Monthly Lakota Chapter Meeting is scheduled on the fourth Tuesday of August (22nd) and is planned to be held at the Torrance Scout Center. Chapter members will be sent an email with the details as soon as they're finalized.
