California Trails Day 2009

DATE: April 18, 2009, meet at 8:00 a.m., registration: 8:00 to 8:30 am

LOCATION: Meet at Wildwood Picnic Area Parking Lot

EVENT: The USDA Forest Service and associated LARRD volunteer organizations will celebrate California Trails Day on April 18, 2009. The celebration will include 4-6 hours of trail work on the Wildwood-Stoneyvale area trails <u>and</u> a lunch to celebrate the event. This event is organized by the volunteer groups of the Los Angeles River Ranger District. Lunch will be held at the Wildwood Picnic Area and will include a short ceremony about California Trails Day. Lunch will be served at 1:00 PM. Activities will end at 3:30 PM.

This activity is open to all volunteers, including sponsored groups. Those who are volunteering for trail work for the first time, please identify yourself to the registrar, so we can arrange for a Trail Boss to provide instruction and proper tools. Please bring personal equipment listed below.

Personal Equipment to Wear while working:

Work gloves, work shoes, work clothes (long sleeve shirts and long pants), sun protection hat, hard-hat (if available), Ten Essentials (include a personal First Aid kit), Water (2 Qt's.), snacks. Be prepared to hike about a mile and work until 12:30. Lunch will be provided at Wildwood Picnic Area.

DIRECTIONS: From 210 Fwy in La Canada, go west on 210 Fwy (7 mi), exit at Sunland Blvd and go east (right turn) to Ora Vista Ave. (6 blocks). Turn left (north) onto Ora Vista Avenue (beware of dips and sharp 90 deg turn). Proceed east 5.5 miles to Wildwood Picnic Area, turn right and proceed down the hill to the parking lot. Allow ½ hour driving time from the 210 Fwy. Carpool if possible.

National Trails Day-2009

The Los Angeles River Ranger District, USDA-Forest Service, and its associated volunteer organizations invite you and your Unit, along with the general public, to join them in celebrating National Trails Day.

- When: June 6, 8:30 am to not later than 3:30 pm.
- Where: Please contact one of the sources listed below <u>after May 30</u> for the location of this event and directions for getting there.

If your Unit has done a conservation project in the forest in the last year, you are a part of this celebration. If you've only heard about the conservation and the Trail Boss Training programs that are a feature of the Angeles National Forest - and enthusiastically supported by the Los Angeles Area Council, come on up with your Scouts to see and hear, first hand, what they are all about. Try your hand at using several of the basic tools of trail maintenance - McCloud, Pulaski, loppers

- and experience the satisfaction that comes from the accomplishments of a trained, enthusiastic group of volunteers. You will also have the opportunity to meet the District Forest Service personnel who direct the volunteer programs. Lunch will be provided about 1:00 pm. An Adventure Pass is not required for vehicles on this date.

This event is open to the public, as well as volunteer organizations and sponsored groups - such as a Scout Unit. If this is the Unit's first time at volunteering for trail work, please identify yourself to the registrar so that arrangements can be made for a Trail Boss to provide instruction and tools. While this field orientation is not a substitute for Trail Boss Training, it will give you a feel for what it involves. It will also give your Scouts a better understanding of the importance of good hiking practices and of doing conservation work.



If you are bringing boys, you <u>must</u> file a Tour Permit with the Council Office, have at least two adults, and adhere to <u>all</u> applicable BSA rules for Unit activities.

Clothing and equipment

Persons attending need to be dressed and equipped to do a few hours of trail work. The fash-ion-conscious volunteer wears long pants, long sleeve shirt, work boots, gloves, and a broad-brimmed hat. These are supplemented with sunscreen/sun block, dark glasses, insect repellant, and **lots of water**. Sneakers/sport shoes are not appropriate wear when swinging a Pulaski and moving large rocks. Conservation project sites tend to be hot, sunny, dusty, and lunchrooms for insects.

Leave No Trace Training-2009

The BSA Los Angeles Area Council-High Adventure Team, in cooperation with the County of Los Angeles-Department of Parks and Recreation, is pleased to offer this workshop on this national program.

Who: Cubs, Scouts, and Venturers; youth leaders, teachers, hikers; everyone who enjoys the outdoors.

What: Fun and informative workshop on the principles of *Leave No Trace*.

When: Saturday, May 9, 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Where: Community Center, Kenneth Hahn State Recreation Area, 4100 S. La Recreation Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA 90056

Leave No Trace (LNT) is a national outdoor skills and ethics education program. The workshop is designed to teach people how to reduce the negative impacts on the natural environment as they travel and camp in the outdoors and to help ensure a positive experience for all visitors. It will introduce you to the principles of Leave No Trace and show you how they can be applied to help protect the natural environment of wilderness and other backcountry locations. The extension of these concepts to protect frontcountry recreation areas near urban centers will also be addressed. Participants will receive written materials and other handouts on how to use and share the LNT Program with others.



A fee of \$10.00 is charged for the training, which covers the cost of the workshop materials, lunch, and refreshments. Registration **must** be received by May 1.
