Winter Camping and Travel Training - 2015

Winter brings a special stillness to the local mountains. The year-round camper knows that the pests of summer – insects, most animals, other people – have gone to ground for the season. While the snowy peaks may appear close and inviting, that same camper knows that the weather and trail conditions require special preparation, skills, and equipment. The objectives of this training are to acquaint the adult Scouter with these needs and to emphasize their importance to a having a safe and enjoyable experience.

This High Adventure training begins with a seminar Saturday, November 7, 2015, 8:15 am to about 4:00 pm, at the Cushman-Watt Service Center, 2333 Scout Way, Los Angeles. There will be a 45-minute lunch break; attendees may bring lunch or purchase it from a near-by take-out. Rolls and coffee are furnished. The seminar is conducted as a series of demonstrations and presentations. The emphasis is on preparing for, and dealing with, a mountainous winter environment, be it rain, cold, snow, or some combination. Sessions cover: the physical demands of winter conditions; snow travel hazards & equipment needs; health & safety; navigation & route finding; menus; food & water needs; personal clothing & equipment; and the desirability of contingency planning. Participants are invited to attend the free seminar, Snow and Ice Travel that follows it (see the separate training bulletin). The weekend backpack in Mt. San Jacinto State Park will be discussed (about 6

miles, round trip, from 8,600 to 10,000 feet). It is scheduled for February 6 and 7 2016; a forecast of insufficient snow or extreme weather conditions will cause rescheduling. Some special equipment (rent/borrow/buy) will be needed.

A fee of \$10.00 is charged for the training. Registration is required by October 23, 2015. You will be sent a confirmation, or a notice of cancellation if there are fewer than 5 sign-ups by that date. Attendance at Adult Leaders Backpack Training is a **requirement** to taking this course. Completion of this training is recognized by the award of a special patch. It is required to earn the High Adventure Leader Award. A syllabus that covers the materials discussed will be given to each participant.

Navigation & Orienteering Training - 2015

- Do you feel uncomfortable about taking your Unit into new locations?
- Do you want to improve your navigation and route-finding skills?
- Have you considered orienteering as an activity for improving your Scouts' map and compass skills?



A workshop in navigation and orienteering will be conducted by the members of GLAAC-HAT on November 14, 2015 at the Firestone Scout Reservation. We will begin Saturday with a discussion of the tools of navigation and strategies for their utilization. Topics will include (but are not limited to) GPS, collecting terrain features, disoriented/lost, etc. We will also discuss Orienteering Events; how they are run and why they are useful in routefinding and off-trail navigation. These activities will be followed by participant-led map-hikes which use the detailed Orienteering map for Firestone. A field experience will be held, in association with the Los Angeles Orienteering Club, on a date to be announced. Participants will help officiate in an LAOC Orienteering meet.

Registration by November 7, 2015 is required, as space is limited. The fee is \$25 per person, by check made payable to BSA. This fee covers the cost of the outing including the day use fee at Firestone and the LAOC program including course maps and materials. Who should attend: Persons interested in being "climbing" Merit Badge Counselors, Camp Staff and all Scouters that want to teach scouts how to climb and rappel at the Unit, District or Council level. All persons interested must be mature, capable of instructing, safety conscious, able to exercise good judgment, be dependable, relate well to youth and adults, and be familiar in the techniques of climbing, rappelling, belaying, and spotting. **Scouters who work with troops and teach climbing are required to be "Qualified Instructors" prior to teaching any climbing/rappelling activities.**

This course is very intense and will work into the late hours of the night. We will cover B.S.A. current National Policies associated with all climbing/rappelling activities, at the Unit, Council and District levels, as outlined in the pamphlet entitled "Climb on Safely," and the National Camp Accreditation Program.

Prerequisites for participation in course:

- Current registration with Boy Scouts of America
- 21 years old
- Current Level I Climbing Instructor
- Current successful completion of B.S.A.'s "Youth Protection Guidelines" training
- Current B.S.A. Annual Health and Medical Record
- Completed the online Climb on Safely Training

- Course size: is limited to 6-12 students. Preregistration requested

- An ATC belaying device
- Three or four locking-gate carabineers
- One 24" and one 48" pre-sewn runner or one 24" pre-sewn runner and a commercially made leash (personal anchor)
- Two pieces of 5-6mm accessory cord, one piece 72" long and the other 96" long.
- Climbing shoes (optional)
- All other gear will be provided by the Directors (ropes, anchors, carabineers, etc.) All personal gear will be inspected prior to use. Please Bring to the Lecture Class.
